Corsicana Sunset Lions Club News - IPDG Jim Jones

The Corsicana Sunset Lions Annual New Year’s Eve Pizza Party for the kids at Corsicana’s Texas Youth Correction’s facility was the largest to date. Hot pizza and soft drinks are a rare treat for these kids. Many service clubs and other organizations hold parties during this holiday season but are usually limited to one cottage. After Christmas, the glow of celebration begins to fade at the facility. We understand this annual party serves as a cushion to soften the end of the holiday season. Local merchants Domino’s Pizza and Brookshire’s once again helped the Sunset Lions with the event to provide 130 pizzas and 70 two-liter bottles of soft drinks. Without their assistance, the

party would have been very difficult to accomplish.

A stack of 130 pizzas stands over 23 feet in height and weighs 335 pounds and took one hour and ten minutes to prepare. However, after delivery was made, it took the kids about ten minutes to dispose of the pizzas. The soft drinks totaled almost 37 gallons. Consumption of this quantity took a little longer.

Our local merchants are repeatedly asked for contributions or discounts for worthy causes and, somehow, help is usually offered. The Sunset Lions appreciate Domino’s and Brookshire’s community spirit.
